## **Display Ideas**

#### **Classroom Management**

Job Responsibility Display the Super Power Super Helpers Mini Bulletin Board. Program the comic speech bubble accents with students' names. Write classroom job titles on the superhero accents. Assign classroom jobs and display each student's name next to the assigned job.

**Be a Super Helper** Use the Super Power Super Helpers Mini Bulletin Board as a helpful reminder of positive behavior characteristics. Ask each student to write words or phrases that are examples of "super helper" behavior on the comic speech bubble pattern [page 4]. Some examples may include *good manners, friendliness, trustworthiness,* and *helpfulness*. Have each student write a sentence or draw a picture that illustrates the words or phrases written on her pattern.

**Super Centers** Use the Super Helpers Job Assignment Mini Bulletin Board for center assignments. Write the names of centers on the superhero accents or copies of the superhero pattern [page 4]. Write students' names on the comic speech bubble accents or copies of the comic speech bubble pattern [page 4]. Place the names of the students in the appropriate centers.

#### **Language Arts**

Super Parts of Speech Enhance a lesson about the parts of speech using the Super Power Super Helpers Bulletin Board. Write the different parts of speech (noun, verb, adjective, adverb, pronoun, conjunction, interjection, and preposition) on the superhero accents. After teaching a lesson on each part of speech, provide each student with multiple copies of the comic speech bubble pattern [page 4]. Ask students to write examples of the corresponding parts of speech on the speech bubble patterns. Invite students to display their examples around the superheroes that correspond with their speech bubble patterns.

## **Display Ideas**

Super Story Elements Use the Super Power Super Helpers Bulletin Board as a graphic organizer for story planning. Label the superhero accents with story parts such as main character, other characters, setting, problem, and conclusion. Allow students to label laminated comic speech bubble accents with information about the story and place the speech bubbles below the corresponding story element. Display the graphic organizer for students to use as a reference when writing about books they have read.

Reading Genres Use the Super Power Super Helpers Mini Bulletin Board to teach students about book genres. Write the names of several book genres, such as science fiction, fairy tale, mystery, fantasy, and historical fiction on the superhero accents or copies of the superhero patterns [page 4]. As new books are introduced to the class, write the titles on the comic speech bubble accents or copies of the comic speech bubble pattern [page 4] and allow students to place them under the appropriate genre.

#### Math

Ways to Show a Number Enhance a unit on number sense using the Super Helpers Job Assignment Bulletin Board. Write numbers on the superhero accents in standard form and place them around the bulletin board. Distribute copies of the comic speech bubble pattern [page 4] to students. Assign each student a specific superhero. Have each student write a different way to show the number on a speech bubble pattern (for example, expanded form, word form, even or odd, blocks, etc.). Invite students to post their speech bubble patterns with models below the corresponding superheroes.

#### **Character Education**

**Super Good Manners** As a class, brainstorm examples of excellent manners. Write them on the superhero accents. Write each student's name on a comic speech bubble accent. Display the superheroes accents on a wall or bulletin board. Whenever a student displays excellent manners, place his name under the corresponding good manner. Title the display *We Have Super Good Manners!*
