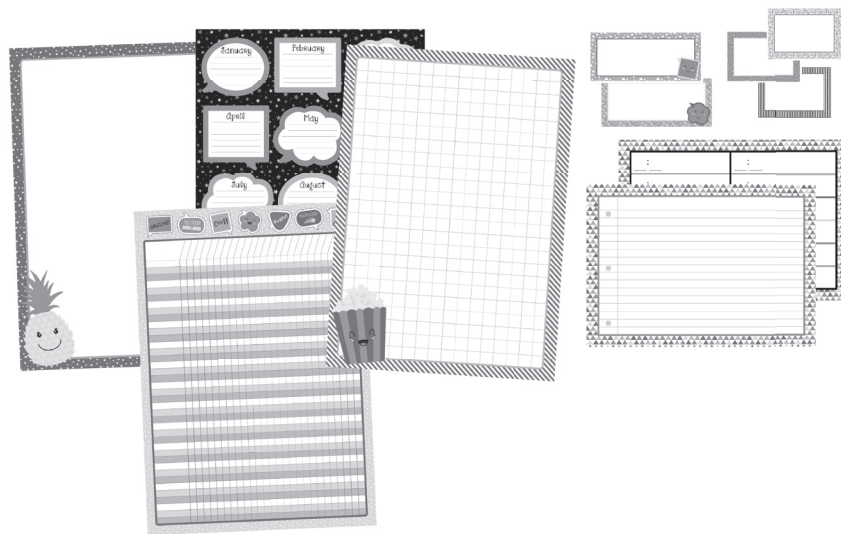

Using the School Pop Classroom Organizers Bulletin Board

Grid Chart

Create bar graphs and picture graphs with the School Pop Classroom Organizers grid chart. Use the chart to take a daily or weekly poll, such as *What is your favorite snack?* Write the answer choices for the graph along the bottom of the chart. As each student enters the classroom for the day, have him color a block indicating his choice.

Month Chart

Use the colorful month chart to display birthdays, upcoming class and school events, and important reminders for each month.

Incentive Chart

Use the inspiring School Pop Classroom Organizers incentive chart to encourage students to exhibit good behavior, to reach reading or math goals, or to keep attendance. Program the incentive chart with students' names along the right-hand side. Label the top section with dates or goals to be met. Use coordinating chart seals to track each student's progress or student attendance.

Blank Chart

The blank chart provides a variety of uses in all subjects. Introduce the word or problem of the day or display weekly spelling or vocabulary words. The chart can also be used to display classroom rules or important upcoming dates to focus on. Use the blank chart as a display tool to showcase students' exemplary work.

Notebook Paper Chart

Use the School Pop Classroom Organizers notebook paper chart to display homework or classroom assignments. The chart can also be used as a "ticket out of the door" at the end of the day. Post the chart by the classroom door. Have students write short phrases about something they have learned during the day as they are leaving the classroom. Use copies of the notebook paper chart [page 4] to place in

a basket in the classroom. Encourage students to write any questions or concerns they have about a new concept and place them in the basket for the teacher to review.

Schedule Chart

Use the blank schedule chart to post the class schedule. Display the chart in a central location so students and visitors to the classroom can easily view it. Provide each student with a copy of the *My Daily Schedule* chart [page 4] and have him write the classroom schedule to keep in a notebook or to post at home.

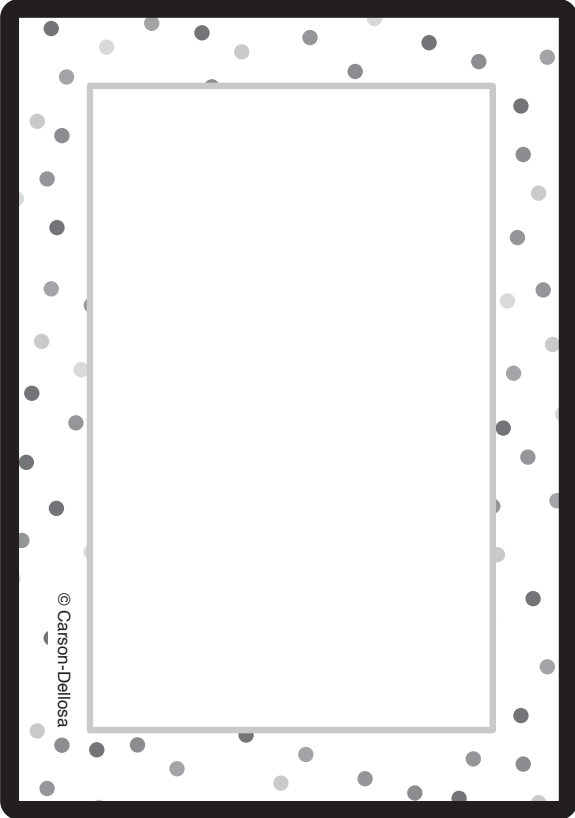
Small Labels

Program the blank small labels or copies of the small labels [page 3] with rewards and incentives such as *Sit at the teacher's desk for a day* or *Wear your favorite fuzzy slippers to class for a day*. Place the labels in a prize box or present students "caught being good" with reward labels throughout the week. The small labels can also be programmed with curriculum vocabulary words and their definitions and placed in a center or displayed on the wall or bulletin board.

Large Labels

Use the blank large labels as subject headers to spotlight individual subject themes and concepts in reading, math, writing, science, and social studies. The large labels or copies of the large labels [page 3] can also be used to label centers and classroom areas.
