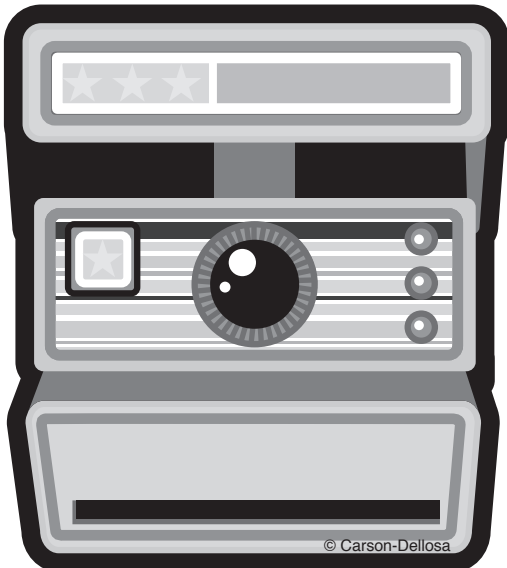
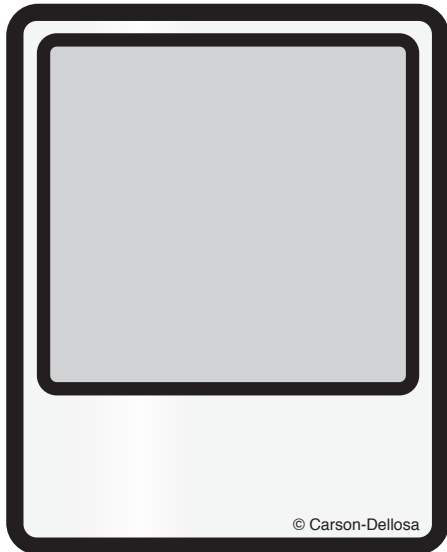
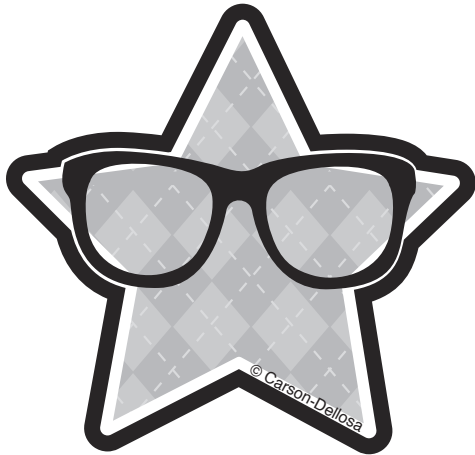

## Display Ideas

### Classroom Management

**Hip-STAR Students** Use the Hip-Star Students Mini Bulletin Board to welcome students to class at the beginning of the year. If school policy permits, take a photo of each student and display his picture in the center of the photo frame accent. Attach the photos to a piece of string with clothespins. Hang the string of photos on or near the classroom door. Title the display Ms. \_\_\_\_\_'s Hip-STAR Students.

**Hip Open House** Use the Hip-STAR Students Mini Bulletin Board to create an open house display. Have students brainstorm welcome messages and write them with write-on/wipe-away markers on the photo frame accents or copies of the photo frame pattern [page 4]. Display the bulletin board in the classroom on or near the door.

**Face-to-Face Interviews** Encourage students to learn about each other at the beginning of the school year by practicing their interviewing skills. If school policy permits, take a photo of each student and display her picture in the center of the photo frame accent. Turn the photos facedown on a table. Allow each student to choose a photo of another student. Have students interview each other about families, interests, hobbies, and goals. After the interview, have students write one-page summaries of their interviews. Display the summaries around the Hip-STAR Students Mini Bulletin Board.

**Flashy Job Assignments** If school policy permits, take a photo of each student and display her picture in the center of the photo frame accent. Use a write-on/ wipe-away marker to assign the student a job on the blank space below the picture. When a student is not assigned a job, the photo can be placed to the side.

## Display Ideas

**Picture-Perfect Work** Use the Hip-STAR Students Mini Bulletin Board to display student work. If school policy permits, take a photo of each student and display her picture in the center of the photo frame accent. When a student has exemplary work to display, attach his photo to the piece of work and place it on or near the Hip-STAR Students Mini Bulletin Board.

**Centers in a Snap** Write the name of each classroom center on a camera or star accent or copies of the camera or star patterns [page 4]. If school policy permits, take a photo of each student and display her picture in the center of the photo frame accent. Assign each student to a center by displaying his photo under the appropriate center.

**Look Who's Here!** Label each star with glasses accent or copies of the star with glasses pattern [page 4] with In and Out. Display on or near the Hip-STAR Mini Bulletin Board. If school policy permits, take a photo of each student and display his picture in the center of the photo frame accent. To keep track of students during the day, have students attach their photos on or near the appropriate star to indicate when they arrive to class, leave early, or attend locations outside of the classroom.

**Caught on Camera** If school policy permits, take a photo of each student and display his picture in the center of the photo frame accent or copy of the photo frame pattern [page 4]. When a student is "caught" with good behavior, label the photo frame accent with the good behavior and place it on or near the Hip-STAR Students Mini Bulletin Board.
