Putting It Together

- Laminate the Hipster Weather Mini Bulletin Board for durability.
- The Hipster Weather Mini Bulletin Board can be displayed on a wall or bulletin board.
- Use the reproducible patterns [page 4] as additional instructional material for students.
- Use pieces of the Hipster Weather Mini Bulletin Board to create fun curriculum games and activities.

Display Ideas

Using the Hipster Weather Mini Bulletin Board

Blank Weekly Weather Chart Use the blank weekly weather chart and the weather symbol accents or copies of the weather symbol patterns [page 4] to track each day's weather for the week.

Today's Weather Chart Use the daily weather chart to track the day's weather. Apply hook-and-loop tape dots to each type of weather on the chart and to the back of the star accents (or to the end of a clothespin and to the back of the star accent). Have volunteers place the stars on the correct category of weather for the day.

Weather Scenes Use the weather scene vignettes with the Hipster character accents as an interactive way to show how to dress for each type of weather. Apply a hook-and-loop tape dot to the center of each weather scene. Then, apply a hook-and-loop tape dot to the back of each character accent. Have a volunteer display the correct weather vignette for the day, then attach the corresponding character to the scene.

Thermometer Use a write-on/wipe-away marker to have students record the morning and afternoon temperatures for each day.

Math

Favorite Weather Use the Hipster Weather Mini Bulletin Board to create a class graph about students' favorite weather. Write types of weather such as rainy, snowy, sunny, and windy on sentence strips. Display the types of weather at the bottom of a graph. Have students place a copy of a Hipster character pattern [page 3] above their favorite weather. Have students count the results to determine which weather is the overall favorite. Display the graph near the Hipster Weather Mini Bulletin Board.

Display Ideas

Hip Shopping Trip Using department store catalogs or circulars, have students prepare a clothing shopping list for each season of weather. Ask students to calculate how much each outfit will cost.

From this data, students can determine which type of weather is the most and least expensive.

Language Arts

Imagining Weather Let students create a twist on the phrase, "It's raining cats and dogs!" Invite each student to pair different types of weather with animals and write silly sentences, such as It's snowing mice and monkeys. Students can illustrate the sentences and display them around the Hipster Weather Mini Bulletin Board.

Science

Dressed for Winter Discuss how certain animals prepare for winter by growing thicker coats of fur. Have students research animals that adapt in this way for winter weather, such as the arctic fox or arctic hare.
