$4 + 6 = 10/6 + 4 = 10$, $3 + 5 = 8/5 + 3 = 8$,
 $8 + 9 = 17/9 + 8 = 17$, $2 + 9 = 11/9 + 2 = 11$

Answers will vary but may include making a 10 from the two 5s and adding the 4 to make a total of 14.

You can use the strategy of making 10 by taking 2 from the 7 and adding it to the 8 to make 10. Then, add the remaining 5 to the 10 to get 15.

Count back 6 from 14 to get 8 bees left in the hive.

Card 13

$7 + 1 = 8$, $12 = 8 + 4$, $11 = 12 - 1$

Card 14

$5 + 4 = 9$, $8 - 7 = 1$, $13 - 6 = 7$, $10 + 5 = 15$

Card 15

$5 + \underline{\quad} = 12$ or $12 - 5 = \underline{\quad}$; Seven dogs joined the first group.

Answers will vary but may include that you can use ten frames and see that 25 apples would take up 2 ten frames and half of another. When 10 more apples are added, you are adding another ten frame with 5 still in the last ten frame. So, 3 full ten frames is 30; 30 and 5 is 35 apples.

26 candies; Answers will vary.

93 rocks; Answers will vary.

Card 29

Answers will vary but may include that you can use a hundred chart to find the first number and move up one square. By moving up a row, you are subtracting 10. $80 - 10 = 70$, $40 - 10 = 30$, $70 - 10 = 60$

Jimmy should have only moved back 2 tens instead of 3. The correct answer is 30 tires.
