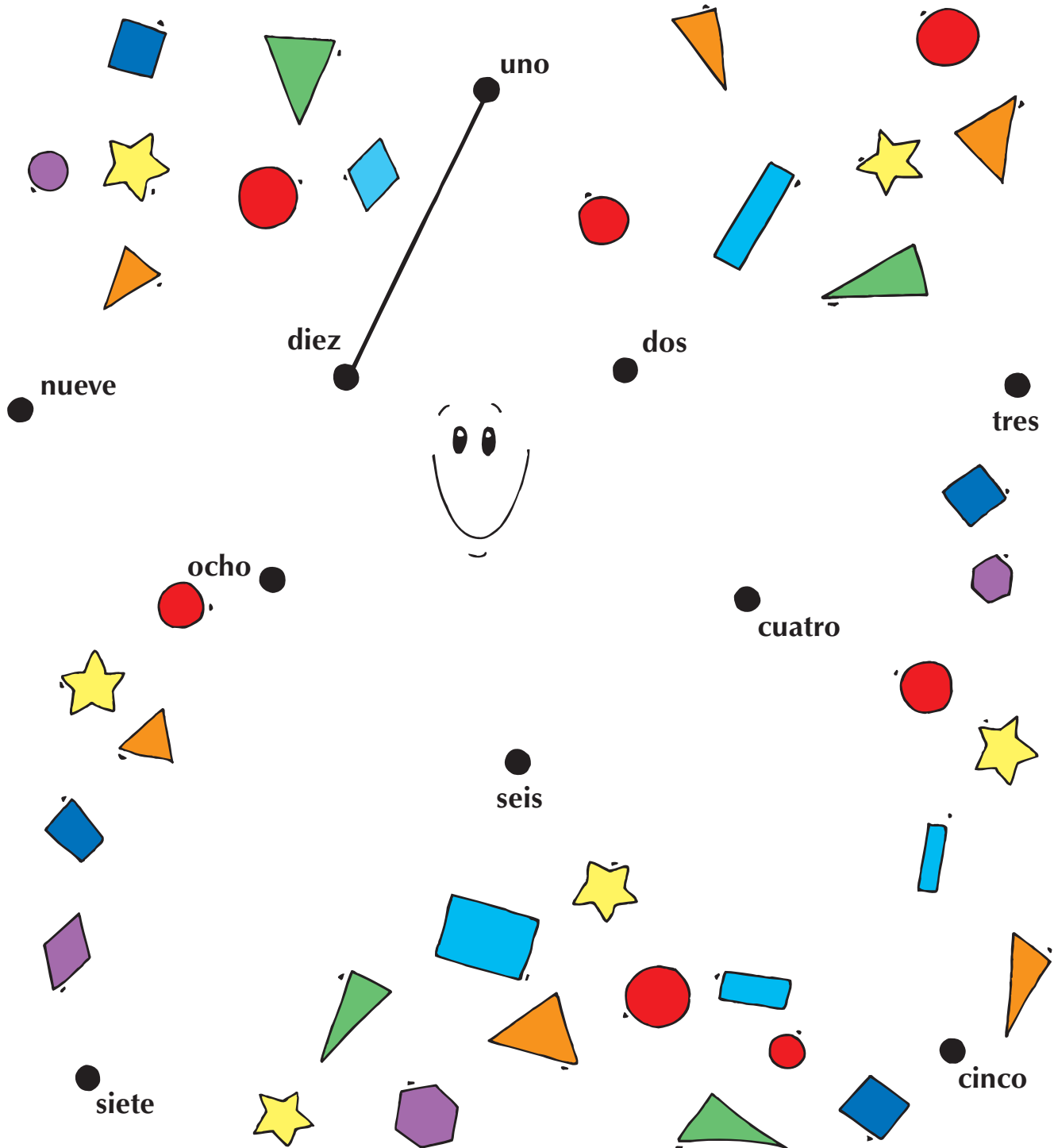

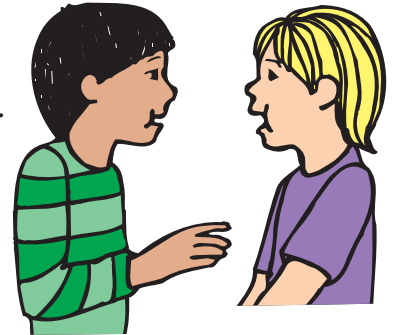
Using You
